Note:

Athletes are counted only one time even though they might be in more than one event when determining the meet surcharge amount on the competition report form(Appendix A2 in the rules and policies). Jeff Oberst's scoring program has two reports, one called an "Entry Fees" report which shows the number of athletes, the other report is the "Pair Group Counts" report which gives the number of pair groups per event.
